



ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION STRATEGY

INTRODUCTION

The Football Association of Wales shares FIFA's objective in protecting the integrity of football, specifically in preventing all methods or practices, such as corruption, doping or match manipulation, which might jeopardise the integrity of matches, Competitions, Players, Officials or give rise to abuse of Association Football.

The FAW aim to implement an effective approach towards preventing and challenging all forms of manipulation and unlawful influencing of football matches, competitions or individual performance.

The objective of the FAW's Anti-Doping Strategy is based on the promotion of integrity and clean sport in order to protect football matches and competitions. This will be achieved through an approach around 3 Core Pillars:

PREVENT: DETECT: RESPOND.

These pillars are comprised of promoting integrity and clean sport at all times through proactively educating and raising awareness throughout the football family to protect the values of clean sport and a level playing field in football.

We will protect football matches and competitions against doping through detection programs and by responding swiftly investigating any alleged breaches and imposing sanctions where sufficient evidence is found proven.

We believe that football should be an equal game where everyone has the same opportunity to be the best they can be and should always attain this cleanly and fairly.

Success should always be strived for and achieved on hard work and merit and not through manipulation or cheating.

The Anti-Doping Education Strategy outlines our commitments and implementation plan in delivering a value based approach for anti-doping education within the prevent pillar of the FAW Integrity Strategy.





OBJECTIVES:

The strategic priority and objective of the FAW's Anti-Doping Strategy is to promote integrity and clean sport in order to protect football matches and competitions. This will be achieved through implementing 3 Core Pillars: **PREVENT:DETECT:RESPOND**.

This document outlines our Education Strategy & Implementation Plan within the Prevent Pillar.







CORE PILLARS

PREVENT

The first stage of the FAW Anti-Doping Strategy is **Prevention** through advocating anti-doping principles. We aim to be proactive in our approach in raising awareness and providing a values-based education programme to the football family, highlighting the values of clean sport and the FAW anti-doping rules and regulations in football.

DETECT

At the second stage of **Detection**, partnership work and mechanisms will be implemented for effective monitoring and reporting of information linked to allegations or suspicion of anti-doping breaches.

RESPOND

The final stage is **Responding** where an allegation, positive test or anti-doping rule vialation is detected. An effective response process will commence involving an investigation leading to sanctions working with UKAD or relevent authority in accordance with FAW Rules and Regulations.



PREVENT

AWARENESS & EDUCATION

PROMOTION OF INTEGRITY & CLEAN SPORT.

Awareness and Promotion of Integrity & Clean Sport Principles and FAW Rules & Regulations.

We will develop and implement campaigns and communications to raise awareness and promote the core principles of integrity and clean sport throughout the year, specifically during periods such as Clean Sport Week (May) and Sport Integrity Week (Sep) to educate and inform the football family in Wales.

We will provide pre-competition briefings on integrity and clean sport before the start of each season for our Member Clubs, Match Officials and our National teams & regional squads.

Educational Training and Prevention Programs.

An important element of the Prevent pillar will be the education of Players, Coaches, Officials and other Player support personnel throughout the football family. Greater awareness and education is the best defence against integrity breaches and in developing a clean sport mentality throughout football. It is important that everyone understands the risks of doping and the consequences of breaching the FAW's anti-doping rules.

We will provide a range of anti-doping educational resources and establish anti-doping education and prevention programmes.

The education and prevention programme will include e-learning modules as well as briefings and educational workshops for Players/Team Officials/Player Support Personnel and all National/National Youth Team Players (working in partnership to implement the programme with other National Associations and Clubs where required).





GIRLS / WOMENS PATHWAY




The above diagram outlines our performance pathway for girls/womens football in Wales.


NATIONAL LEAGUE STRUCTURE

MONITORING & EVALUATION

This is essential to assess individuals who have not yet accessed the education programme and when revalidation is required.

The FAW Anti-Doping Education Strategy & Implementation Plan will be monitored by the FAW Integrity Manager and FAW Board Anti-doping Lead and progress will be tracked using the RAG & progress sections of the above implementation Plan. Changes to the Implementation Plan will be made as required and a report will be provided to the FAW CEO & Board annually.

The FAW will provide monitoring information to UKAD or other key stakeholders upon request.
